LIEUTENANT COLONEL WILLIAM E. LEE

The Koren Kolligian, Jr. Trophy is presented to Lieutenant Colonel William E. Lee, 96th Flying Training Squadron, Laughlin Air Force Base, Texas. On 22 March 2013, Colonel Lee was performing a solo T-38C functional check flight departing from Laughlin Air Force Base. During the flight, the rear cockpit multi-function display dislocated from the rear cockpit console and became lodged between the control stick and the instrument panel. Colonel Lee experienced the aircraft abruptly pitch up and roll violently to the left. He attempted to correct the pitch, but was unable to achieve any forward stick movement. He determined that 70 degrees of bank was required to maintain level flight. With 10 minutes of fuel remaining, Colonel Lee executed a controllability check and configured with partial flaps to maintain control. During his return to base, he essentially relearned how to fly the aircraft using only rudder, ailerons, and differential power to maintain a controlled descent. Just prior to touchdown, Colonel Lee experienced an un-commanded roll at which time he added power. This action ceased the rolling motion and he completed the landing, stopping only a few feet prior to the raised barrier. The safety awareness and risk management these accomplishments exhibit, reflect great credit upon Colonel Lee, Air Education and Training Command, and the United States Air Force.
